

# **LEARNING OBJECTIVES FOR SAFE & SOUND**

# **Attitudes**

- Young people have increased empathy for people affected by abusive relationships including domestic abuse and teenage partner abuse.
- Young people have an increased awareness of: what makes a good and bad relationship, the need for consent in a relationship, their right to respect and their responsibility to give respect in a relationship.
- The importance of getting out of an abusive relationship.

# **Skills**

- Young people have an increased ability to assess risk and identify abuses of power and control in relationships.
- Young people have an increased ability to identify a range of support networks or services that can provide support for those in abusive relationships or experiencing domestic abuse at home.
- Young people have an increased confidence in seeking support if they are in an abusive relationship or experiencing domestic abuse at home.

# Knowledge

- Young people have increased knowledge of what local services can do to support young people affected by abusive relationships or Domestic Abuse e.g. Women's Aid and Respect.
- Young people have increased knowledge of the definitions of abusive relationships including teenage partner abuse and domestic abuse.
- Young people have increased knowledge of the different forms of abuse in relationships.

## **KEY FINDINGS FROM EVALUATION**

- There was a 93% increase in young people who identified 'emotional abuse' as a form of abuse in a relationship after seeing Safe & Sound.
- 86% stated that as a result of the session they felt 'confident' or 'very confident' about telling someone if they were experiencing difficulties or control in a relationship.
- 95% would recommend the session for the next year's pupils.
