BULLY 4 U SECONDARY / COLLEGE VERSION

Research by National Centre for Social Research found that 47% of 14 year olds and 41% of 15 year olds reported being bullied. Cyberbullying and online safety are also major concerns among children and teenagers with an increase in bullying via mobiles, email, consoles and websites. Bullying within relationships, homophobia and sexual and sexist bullying as well as the impacts of sexting are also major issues for many schools.

HOW WE CAN HELP

Bully 4 U is a safe and carefully structured theatre in education programme that helps young people aged 11 upwards to learn about and protect themselves against bullying. The session covers many forms of bullying including cyber, sexist/sexual, bullying linked to sexting and homophobic bullying. Bully 4 U supports PSHE work on respect in relationships and includes work looking at male victims of teenage relationship abuse.

WHAT WE DO

Bully 4 U includes a drama and interactive workshop, available in different formats to suit your budget and timetable. We can work with a whole year group in one day for theme or drop down days or can do more targeted work with class sized groups. We are very low tech; we come to your venue and can run sessions in spaces such as classrooms, school halls or youth centres. Versions are also available for parents, training professionals or conference presentations.

- Young people have an increased understanding of different forms of bullying including cyber bullying, homophobic bullying, sexual / sexist bullying and teenage relationship abuse.
- Young people have an increased ability to identify a range of effective strategies in dealing with bullying / cyber bullying.
- Young people have increased knowledge of what relevant and appropriate services can offer to support young people affected by bullying / cyber bullying, and sexting e.g. Childline.
