

Introduction

This summary report covers a theatre in education (T.I.E.) tour in a number of Dudley primary schools. The tour was delivered by Loudmouth Education & Training, with the aim to educate children about puberty and the transition from primary to secondary school. It used Loudmouth's longstanding theatre in education programme 'My Mate Fancies You' which is a drama performance and interactive workshop on puberty, transitions and growing up.

Teaching staff were given access to a term's worth of Loudmouth's online lesson plans that accompany the programme. Teaching staff can use the lesson plans to help them prepare the pupils for the theatre in education sessions and also to run follow up work to consolidate the pupils' learning.

The tour was part-funded by Dudley Public Health and we would like to thank Kath Clarke, Sex and Relationships Education Co-ordinator, Dudley Healthy Schools Public Health Programme for her support.

Executive Summary

- From April 2014 to July 2014, Loudmouth Education & Training ran 'My Mate Fancies You', an interactive theatre in education tour of 30 primary schools in Dudley.
- Loudmouth delivered a total of 41 sessions for Year 5 and 6 pupils, aged 9 11. Fourteen of these sessions were delivered in priority schools.
- The programme that was delivered is called 'My Mate Fancies You'. This well researched and interactive programme explores the often daunting physical and emotional changes associated with puberty and prepares the children for the smooth transition from primary to secondary school. As with all of Loudmouth's work, 'My Mate Fancies You' supports learners to understand the importance of creating healthy, happy and safe relationships.
- A total of 1204 pupils participated in the 'My Mate Fancies You' programme.
- Loudmouth signposted all of the pupils to ChildLine as a support service by delivering ChildLine's key messages during the session and distributing a signposting card to every pupil at the end of each session. Before the session ChildLine was not in the top answers given by pupils on who they could go to for support. After the sessions it was the second highest response with 45%.
- Teaching staff were given access to a term's worth of Loudmouth's online lesson plans that accompany the programme. Teaching staff can use the lesson plans to help them prepare the pupils for the theatre in education sessions and also to run follow up work to consolidate the pupils' learning.
- 97% of pupils thought that 'My Mate Fancies You' was helpful.
- 98% of pupils and 100% of staff stated that they would recommend the programme for next year's pupils.
- 95% of pupils stated after seeing 'My Mate Fancies You' that they 'know quite a bit' or are 'very knowledgeable' about the physical changes that take place during puberty.
- 96% of pupils stated after seeing 'My Mate Fancies You' that they 'know quite a bit' or are 'very knowledgeable' about the emotional changes that take place during puberty.
- After seeing 'My Mate Fancies You' 96% of the pupils thought it was important or very important to learn about puberty.
- 87% of staff stated that 'My Mate Fancies You' had increased their own confidence in delivering work around the issues.
- 100% of staff rated the programme as above average or excellent with 94% stating it was excellent.

Conclusions

The evaluation results from the tour have proven that the programme has been very successful and clearly had an impact on the pupils and staff.

All of the learning objectives were met, with the children learning about puberty and transitions in a safe and engaging way through interactive drama and discussion.

The evaluation results clearly show the success of the tour, showing that 'My Mate Fancies You' greatly increases the knowledge and confidence of the pupils on the issues of puberty and transitions and the increase in staffs' confidence in delivering further work on the issues. It was interesting to see that only 30% of staff had seen the online lesson plans Loudmouth provides to accompany this programme. We promote the lesson plans during the booking process and when we are visiting each school however there is a large number of staff who aren't hearing about or seeing these. The use of the lesson plans would add even more value to the programme. This is something we could look at for future years, how to get more schools using the lesson plans.

The evaluation results show that interactive theatre is the pupils' preferred method of learning about the subject of puberty and that they would recommend it to next year's pupils. Similarly all staff rated the programme highly with 100% recommending it to other schools. This clearly highlights that there is strong need for the work to continue.

The report also demonstrates that this approach is a powerful way to communicate key messages about where children and young people can get support. The increase in knowledge around ChildLine was staggering from 0 to 45%. At Loudmouth we feel we could improve on this and if the funding was available next year to repeat this tour, we will give ourselves a target of over 50% of the participating children knowing about ChildLine by the end of the session.

A total of 1204 children have participated in the theatre in education sessions. This is an increase of 52 children from last year's tour. The tour went to 3 more schools than last year. This year we introduced a range of more flexible formats so that schools who may have been limited by time and/or money could have the programme in. It is very encouraging to see we gained schools and pupil numbers as a result.

It is encouraging to see that all schools paid a fixed contribution towards the costs. Many schools at the time of writing in July 14 have already booked dates in for next year hoping for repeat funding. At present no future funding has been confirmed.

Summary of Activity

The tour commenced in April 2014 and concluded in July 2014. A total of 41 sessions were delivered for children aged 9 - 11 years, in 30 Dudley primary schools. Each school paid a fixed financial contribution towards the cost of each of their sessions.

A total of 1204 children were reached. The full summary of sessions and gender breakdown is below:

The majority of sessions were run with a class at a time working with up to 35 young people in a session. We ran 5 year group sessions this year where the performance element of the session was run with a whole year group followed by a series of class sized workshops.

Qualitative Feedback From Pupil Evaluations

The feedback from pupils was overwhelmingly positive. Here are a few examples of the things the young people said about the sessions:

"The session has made me feel confident within myself, I feel like I can talk to people, I'm not on my own."

"This was very fun and interactive! :-)"

"I've learnt to be more confident about puberty."

The 'My Mate Fancies You' session is helpful because...

"...it helps you understand what happens to males and females during puberty."

"...it involved all body changes for boys and girls."

"... I now understand words that I didn't know and the changes."

"...I now know more things about relationships and puberty."

"Learning about puberty is important in my education."

"Safe. Confident. Freedom. I now know I can talk to someone."

"I thought 'My Mate Fancies You' was amazing because it made me laugh a lot and I would recommend it to next year's pupils."



Quantitative Information from Staff and Pupil Evaluation Forms



Staff members present at the sessions were also asked to complete an evaluation form.


Staff Evaluation Results




Members of staff were asked how they rate the 'My Mate Fancies You' session. 100% rated it above average or excellent with 94% stating it was excellent.




100% of staff would recommend 'My Mate Fancies You' to other schools and organisations.




98% of staff stated that 'My Mate Fancies You' had greatly or considerably increased the group's knowledge of the physical and emotional changes that take place during puberty.



96% of staff stated that 'My Mate Fancies You' had greatly or considerably increased the group's awareness that these changes are a normal and natural part of growing up.




78% of staff stated that 'My Mate Fancies You' had greatly or considerably increased the group's knowledge of relevant services that can offer help or support to children.




94% of staff said that 'My Mate Fancies You' had had some increase in their confidence in delivering work around the issues. 64% of staff stated that 'My Mate Fancies You' had greatly or considerably increased their confidence. However only 30% of staff recorded that they had seen the online lesson plans that accompany Loudmouth's visits to the school.

Pupil Evaluation Results



You can clearly see the shift between pre and post session evaluations with 95% of pupils stating that they 'know quite a bit' or are 'very knowledgeable' about the physical changes that take place during puberty after seeing 'My Mate Fancies You'. Only 50% thought this before seeing 'My Mate Fancies You'.



Again you can clearly see the shift between pre and post session evaluations with 96% of pupils stating post session that they 'know quite a bit' or are 'very knowledgeable' about the emotional changes that take place during puberty. 80% thought this before seeing 'My Mate Fancies You'.

The young people were asked to list 3 types of changes that take place during puberty.


The top answers before the 'My Mate Fancies You' sessions were:


The top answers after the 'My Mate Fancies You' sessions were:

There was an increase in the number of people who could identify key changes. Some new body changes were given that they didn't identify before seeing 'My Mate Fancies You' e.g. wet dreams and sweat.



After seeing 'My Mate Fancies You' 96% of the pupils thought it was important or very important to learn about puberty. This is an increase from 80% before the session.



After seeing 'My Mate Fancies You' 77% of pupils feel confident or very confident about talking to someone about any worries or concerns they have about puberty. Before the session only 44% stated this.

The pupils were asked to name 3 people or places where they could go for advice and information on puberty.






ChildLine, who were the main service signposted to the pupils, was not given as an answer before the Loudmouth sessions took place. This was the second top answer after the 'My Mate Fancies You' sessions with 45% of pupils identifying the service as where they could go to for support. This clearly shows that the signposting learning objective of the programme was met. Whilst parents stayed the top answer nobody included guardians in this answer until after the 'My Mate Fancies You' session.



A clear majority (78%) of children preferred the approach used in 'My Mate Fancies You' to learn about puberty and growing up, using interactive drama and workshops.



98% of pupils stated that they would recommend the programme for next year's pupils.



97% of pupils thought that 'My Mate Fancies You' was helpful to them.

Appendix

My Mate Fancies You Learning Objectives

Attitudes and Values

- Children have an increased awareness of what makes a good and bad relationship.
- Children have an increased awareness that there will be changes as they go through puberty and that this is okay and normal.
- Children have an increased awareness of their own and other people's feelings and emotions.
- Children have increased empathy for the changes and views for both genders.

Skills

- Children have an increased ability to communicate effectively with their parents around independence.
- Children have an increased confidence in seeking help and support about puberty and growing up.
- Children have an increased ability to cope with the physical changes (particularly periods).

Knowledge

- Children have increased knowledge of the physical and emotional changes that take place during puberty.
- Children have increased knowledge of relevant and appropriate services that can offer help or support to children, e.g. ChildLine.
