- the law relating to the supply and possession of illegal substances.
- how the use of alcohol and drugs can lead to risky sexual behaviour.

<u>Objective</u>

Helping young people to stay safe around alcohol and drugs.

This lively drama and discussion workshop helps young people to learn about alcohol and substance misuse. The programme gives strategies to help stay safe, and insight into the impact of alcohol and substance misuse can have on the body, behaviour and future choices e.g. sexual behaviour.

Outcomes

Proven increase of young people's knowledge and skills around alcohol and drug awareness

Evaluation has shown that this programme has increased young people's knowledge of the laws, health risks and impacts around drug and alcohol misuse. After the session the young people have increased skills around staying safe around drugs and alcohol and accessing support.



- 92% could correctly identify one unit of alcohol after the session. Only 36% could identify this before.
- 100% after the session identified that 'legal highs' are illegal. 28% before.
- 99% said that the session helps young people to stay safe around alcohol and drugs.
- 100% of staff said that the programme had increased their confidence in teaching about the issues.
